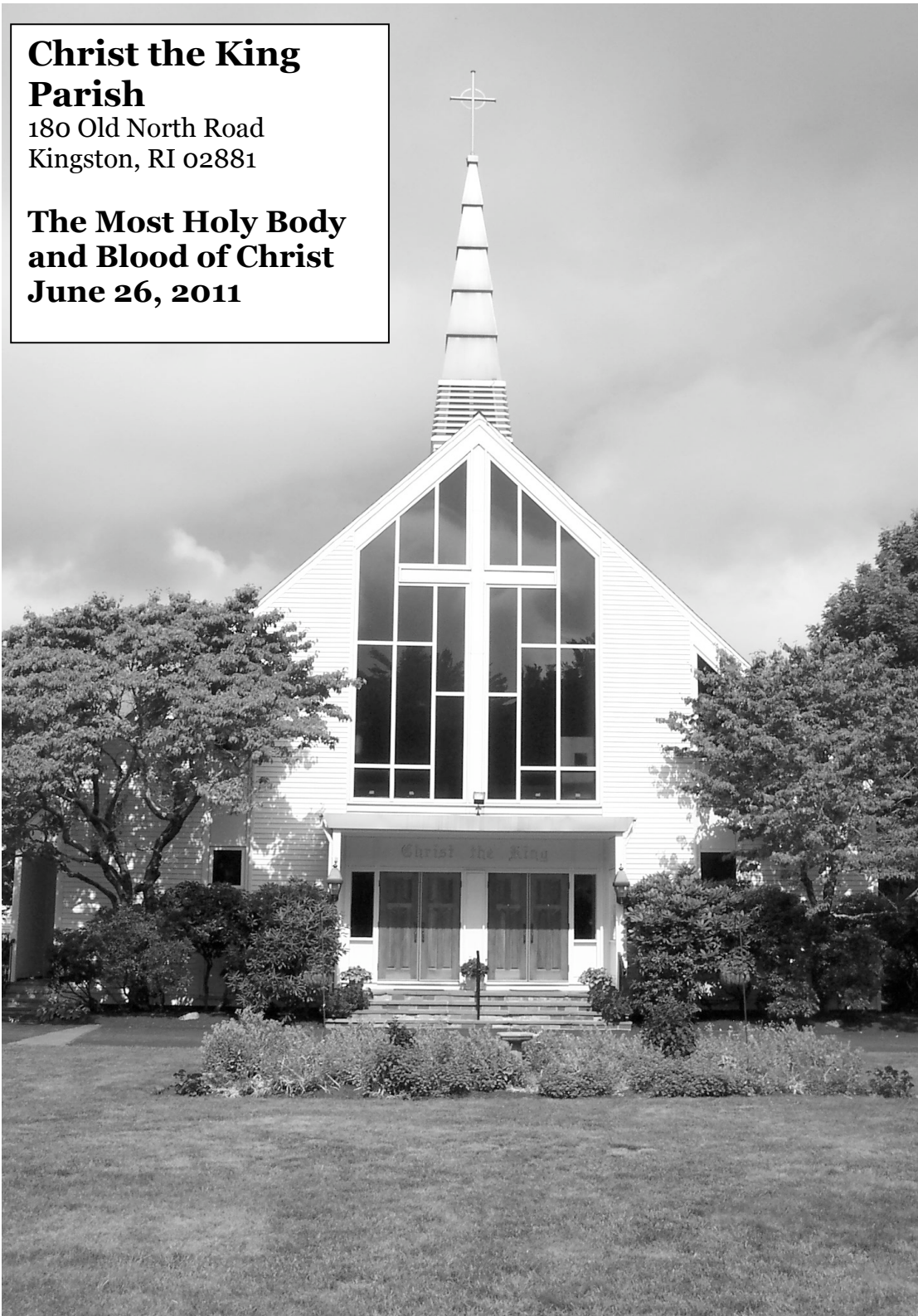

PONDERING



It is hard to explain how ideas for Pondering get into my head. Most often I read something that either confirms or challenges an opinion that is gestating in my mind. Sometimes it comes from people watching; other times flash insight when previously disparate realities magically unite.

Sometime during the Easter season as I was getting ready to preside at liturgy, I looked up at two families coming in the main doors of the church. Both families are regular churchgoers and I had seen them many times before. On that given Sunday I saw beneath the surface and was granted a different insight.

One family was a mother with three children in tow. There is a father and he is a nominal Catholic. He shows up for his children's sacramental events and more often than not for Christmas and Easter. Most Sundays I see this family and immediately begin to wonder what it would take to get the father back to regular church attendance. On that Sunday, my attention was drawn to the mother, who without any support from her husband is so dedicated to her faith and to the growing faith of her children. I can only imagine the discussions that take place at home especially as the children get older. The "How come I have to go to church if dad doesn't have to go?" question along with its many cousins. There are more families like this than I would like to see.

Sometimes it is the father, sometimes it is the mother who is the nominal member but it is always difficult when children see a divided front from parents.

Today I would like to thank those parents who fight the good fight, who are faithful in season and out of season – parents who are forced to listen to questions that spring from behaviors other than their own. Sometimes, I am sure, you are tempted to just give up and drop out but you have not and for that I commend you. Keep up the good work. Someday your children will thank you and maybe your silent witness of faithfulness may someday lead your non-practicing spouse back to church.

You are going to have to wait two weeks for the story about the other family who came through the doors at the same time. Here's a hint – one of the parents is a practicing non-Catholic.
